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Dr. Davies Adeloye is a medical doctor and epidemiologist with extensive clinical, research and training experience in Nigeria and the United Kingdom. In October 2011, he was awarded the prestigious Charles Darwin International Scholarship of the University of Edinburgh to pursue a PhD in Population Health Sciences, which he completed in 2014.

Davies' PhD involved working with a team of international experts on Global Health Epidemiology. He particularly focused on collating evidence on the burden of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) in Africa. He has over 40 publications in respected international outlets, including journal articles, book chapters and conference papers.

Davies Adeloye is an emerging name in Global Health, NCDs and Cancer Research. He received an award by the United States National Institutes of Health for the 2017 Cancer Prevention Program. In November 2017, he received the African Cancer Leadership Institute (ACLI) award of the African Organization for Research and Training in Cancer (AORTIC). He is also a recipient of the 2018 American Association for Cancer Research (AACR) award for African Researchers.

He has also been recognized in the public health research space in Nigeria. In 2017, he won as a co-host the African Carnegie Diaspora Fellowship awarded by the United States Institute of International Education to develop public health curriculum at Covenant University. In 2015, Davies was on the headlines of many national and international media outlets based on his research on estimates of hypertension in Nigeria, now regarded as the first nation-wide and regional estimates of hypertension in Nigeria. He has followed this with national and regional estimates of type 2 diabetes and childhood immunization coverage in Nigeria, published in high impact journals.

In January 2018, Davies was appointed Co-Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Global Health Reports (published by the University of Edinburgh). He is a member of the Global Health Epidemiological Reference Group (GHERG), AORTIC and AACR. He currently heads the Global Health Research Institute in Nigeria, which focusses on generating best evidence on burden of disease across African countries. He is also an Honorary Research Fellow at the Centre for Global Health Research, The University of Edinburgh, UK. He serves as a reviewer for several international journals including The Lancet, BMJ and PLoS Series. He has supervised and still supervising postgraduate students in epidemiology and public health. His research interests are global health epidemiology, non-communicable diseases, and cancer. He has published at an average of 6 papers per year over the last 5 years.
